FORMER national and state title medal winning swimmer Jacqui Stewart is charting new

Gone are the days when she glided through the pool as a swimmer under the stewardship of her coach Justin Rothwell at the Whitlam Leisure Centre.

The one-time butterfly competitor has spread her wings into coaching and Stewart said she wishes to develop her mentoring

Stewart has also attained the required coaching accreditation for her working career.

In fact, the blonde-haired teenager is in a "new pond" with swimming – working as one of several coaches on Rothwell's staff.

Stewart said coaching provided her with an income while she studied to be a primary school teacher.

The 19-year-old gave away swimming a few years ago.

"When I was studying for the Higher School Certificate I stopped competitive swimming, Stewart said. "I enjoyed swimming, but I had to concen-

trate on my studies. "Moving to coaching is something I enjoy and it's good to teach young swimmers about technique. I can appreciate what the young

swimmers go through with training, having been there myself. I see coaching and teaching as intertwined."

There was a time when netball was also a prominent sport in Stewart's life.

'I played netball at Campbelltown and I was also swimming, I had to decide which sport and I chose swimming," she said. Rothwell said his former talented swimmer

has made a smooth transition to coaching.
"Jacqui has a fantastic attitude and she

communicates well with the kids in the program," Rothwell said.

"Having been here as a swimmer she has a natural empathy for swimmers and what they go through training."
