Zoe Diamond won two gold medals in the 13 years 100m breaststroke in record time and gold in the 100m freestyle as well as four silver medals in other races.

Keiran Qaium won silver in the 14 years 100m butterfly and Brooke Dodson won bronze in the 13 years 100m butterfly.
